Biographies: Students will engage with a variety of information and imaginative texts about migration to Australia. They will identify informative text structures, exploring how structural features help the reader navigate texts to find information; and learn how concepts and information can be represented visually through tables, maps and diagrams. Students will research and create informative texts that include cohesive paragraphs. They will use a variety of sentence structures to elaborate, extend and explain ideas. Assessment: Students will read, view and comprehend informative texts. They will write a biography of a well-known person who migrated to Australia. Interpreting and using timetables	Chemistry - Reversible & Irreversible Changes Students investigate changes that can be made to materials and how these changes are classified as reversible or irreversible. Assessment: Plan and conduct an investigation into reversible and irreversible changes, including identifying variables to be changed and measured, describing potential safety risks, identifying improvements to methods and constructing texts to communicate ideas, methods and findings.	HASS Continued from Term 1 as well as new unit 'Australia's Connections to The World" The unit begins with a structured study of the physical geography of the region, that should help students develop their geography knowledge and skills. Students then explore the human geography of the region through the diversity of the cultures and histories, and examine how our modern, interconnected world has influenced life in Australia. Assessment: Multi media presentation on a country of choice (linked into English Unit)	DESIGN TECHNOLOGY Miss Rizk Students will continue the 'Packaging' unit exploring different types of packaging. Students will develop an understanding of a product's design and the choice of appropriate materials to use. They will design and test a package that will safely deliver a plant overseas to Japan. Through investigations, students will observe and gather information about what makes a successful package.
